Availability: Sizes and prices listed reflect what will be available in the spring. Many changes occur as the season progresses due to restocking of sold out items and transplanting into larger containers.

Special Orders: If the size or variety you need is not listed, we will be glad to locate it for you. Please ask for a quote.

*Please note that prices, sizes and availability are subject to change.*

### Guide to Abbreviations

**B+B (Balled and Burlaped):** These plants have been field dug with the soil around the roots intact. The root ball is then wrapped in burlap and tied.

**BR (Bare Root):** The soil is removed from the roots when these plants are field dug. They are an outstanding value but are only available the last 2 weeks in April. We can take BR orders for any deciduous plant at any time for the following spring season.

**G (Gallon Size):** Used to designate container size. (Example: 10/15 G means 10 or 15 gallon). This is used for plants grown in containers or BR plants that have been planted in pots.

\* Newly potted BR material is available after July 1st only. This gives the root system time to get established in the pot and prevents damage during planting.

**WH (Whips):** Young trees with a strong central leader and few branches.

## FRUIT

### APPLES

Plant 2 varieties within 100 feet of each other for cross pollination. All varieties ripen mid-August through early September. All varieties on standard rootstock, hardy in Zone 3.

- Hazen 10G \$50.00  
Fruit is large and dark red, with juicy, green-yellow flesh. Flavor is sweet and mild, good for fresh eating, cooking, and as a dessert apple. Short storage life. Tree is a natural semi-dwarf, growing 10-15' high. Does well without spraying. Blooms early—grow with other early or mid season bloomers.
- Northern Lights 10G \$50.00  
Large red apple reaching 3" in diameter. Mild flavor good for eating and cooking. Short storage life. Grows 20' high, 20' wide. Mid-season bloomer—grow with any other variety.
- Red Duchess \*10G \$50.00  
Medium to large red fruit with tart flavor. Good for eating but best for pies 15G \$50.00  
or sauce. Short storage life. Very productive. Grows 20' high and wide. Early bloomer—grow with other early or mid season bloomers.
- State Fair \*10G \$50.00  
Medium sized, red striped fruit. Flavor is slightly tart and good for eating 15G \$50.00  
or baking. Good texture, short storage life. Early season bloomer—grow with other early or mid season bloomers.

### PEARS

Most pears are self-sterile, so 25-50% of the trees should be pollinators. Most pears that bloom at the same time are suitable pollinators. All varieties are hardy in Zone 3.

- Ure \*10G \$50.00  
Fruit is greenish yellow, very juicy, and measures 2" in diameter. Good for eating and canning. Ripens around Aug. 15.
- Golden Spice 10G \$52.00  
Fruits measure 1 3/4" and are medium yellow, lightly blushed with dull red. Ripens mid-season. Good for canning and spicing, fair for eating.

### PLUMS

Most plums (except Mt. Royal) are self-sterile and require pollination by either *Toka* or *Prunus americana*.

- Toka 15G \$48.00  
Good pollinator. A medium sized, richly flavored variety with a beautiful apricot color. Blooms late April and ripens mid-August. Grows 15-20' high.
- Mt. Royal 10G \$44.00  
Excellent for fresh eating or in jams. A blue cultivar with tender, juicy flesh. Blooms in early May; ripens in late August. Self-fruitful variety which requires no other plum for pollination. Grows 8-12' high. Zone 4.

## CHERRY

### Evan's Bali

10G \$54.00

Deep red fruit 1" in diameter excellent for baking and fresh eating. Considered a sour cherry but fruit is much sweeter than other sour cherries. Blooms early May, ripens in August. Grows 10-15'. Self-fertile.

### Mesabi

15G \$54.00

Classified a sour cherry, the red-fleshed fruits have a sugar content midway between a pie cherry and Bing cherries. Blooms in early May, ripening in early July. Grows 10-14' high. Zone 4.

## APRICOT

### Scout

\*7G \$50.00

Blooms in early May with fruit ripening in early August. Fruit is bronze-gold, blushed with red. Good for canning and jam, fair for fresh eating. Self-fertile but yields improve with a pollinator. Grows 10-15' high.

## BLUEBERRY

Require an acidic soil with a pH of 4.5-5.5 for best results. Plant in a moist, well drained site with added peat moss. All varieties are self-fertile unless noted, however, when two varieties are planted together, cross-pollination produces fruit that ripens earlier and is larger.

### Low Bush

#### - Chippewa

1G \$18.00

Very sweet, large dark blue fruits. Growth habit is upright, with glossy, dark green leaves that turn bright red in the fall. Grows 30-40" tall.

#### - Northcountry

1G \$18.00

Berries are an attractive sky blue color with a sweet and mild flavor. Mature plants are 18-24" tall, 30-40" wide. Leaves turn bright red in the fall. Yields are better when planted with another blueberry variety.

#### - Northblue

1G \$18.00

Short plants grow 20-30" in height. Berries are dark blue with good flavor.

### High Bush

#### - Blue Ray

3G \$40.00

Produces high quality, powder-blue berries in midseason. Growth habit is upright and open; reaches 5' at maturity.

#### - Bluecrop

3G \$40.00

Midseason blueberry with consistent yield, high quality fruit, and good disease resistance. Considered by many to be the best overall variety for home gardeners. Growth is upright and open; it reaches 4-6' in height.

#### - Jersey

1G \$18.00

A favorite for home gardeners who want an easy to grow, heavy producing late season variety. Fruits are dark blue, small to medium in size, with a very sweet flavor. Excellent for baking. Grows 5-6' high.

- Patriot

3G \$40.00

Bears very large, firm fruit with good flavor. Ripens early. Growth habit is vigorous, open, and upright. Fall foliage is fiery orange. Grows 4-6' high.

- Northland

\*1G \$18.00

Bears small fruits that have a wild berry flavor. Branches are limber and do not break under heavy snow loads, and the shrub is well adapted to cold climates. Grows 3-4' with a spreading habit.

## RASPBERRY

Royalty

\*1G \$14.00

A cross between a purple raspberry and a red raspberry, with large fruit size and plant vigor and high fruit quality. Good flavor for fresh eating and good insect resistance. Produces outstanding jam and jelly. Suckers sparingly. Zone 4.

Souris

1G \$12.00

An improved red summer-bearing raspberry, with sweeter fruits and higher yields. Good for fresh eating, canning and freezing. Very hardy. Grows 3-4' high and wide.

## KIWI – See Vines

### SHADE AND FLOWERING TREES

*Acer platanoides* 'Crimson King' – Crimson King Maple

20G \$95.00

Slow growing tree providing dense shade. Reaches 35' in height and 35' in width. Has maroon-red foliage all season long. Zone 4.

15G \$90.00

*Acer rubrum* - Red Maple

10-15G \$62.00

Fairly rapidly growing tree. Has showy red flowers in early spring, with red to yellow fall foliage. Takes shade to full sun. Grows 50' tall, 35-40' wide with a rounded, upright growth habit.

*Acer saccharinum* - Silver Maple

15G \$56.00

Fast growing tree with a graceful form. Tolerates a wide range of soils, making it a good choice for difficult sites. Grows 60-70' high, 35-45' wide. Fall foliage is yellow.

*Acer saccharum* – Sugar Maple

\*15G \$78.00

Largest of the native maples, with a slow to medium growth rate. Prefers rich, well drained soil. Fall foliage ranges from yellow to orange and red. Grows 50-75' high, 50' wide.

*Betula nigra* – River Birch

single 10G \$58.00

A native birch that does well in well drained or wet soils. Reddish

clump \*10G \$68.00

exfoliating bark creates an interesting winter effect. Resistant to bronze birch borer. Grows 40-50' high, 30-40' wide.

*Betula papyrifera* - Paper Birch single 10G \$56.00  
 Beautiful white peeling bark develops as tree matures. Develops an clump \*7G \$50.00  
 oval, rounded crown at maturity. Fall foliage is yellow. Grows 40' high, 30' wide.

*Fraxinus pensylvatica* "Patmore" –Patmore Ash 15G \$69.00  
 A seedless cultivar of native green ash, which develops an elliptical crown, uniform and symmetrical.  
 Very few disease and insect problems. Fall foliage is yellow. Grows 50-60' high, 35' wide.

*Hydrangea paniculata* Bulk – Quick Fire Hydrangea 7G \$88.00  
 Tree form is perfect for smaller gardens. Blooms by early June, a month earlier than other hydrangeas.  
 Flowers turn a deep pink. Grows 6-8' high and wide.

### Malus Cultivars - Crabapples

Location: Pick a sunny spot with good air drainage (not in a frost pocket). For a harsh, wind-swept site, Dolgo is recommended.

Soil: Must be moist, but well drained. Dry sandy soil should be improved with organic matter (peat, compost, etc.). pH should be nearly neutral, so add plenty of lime or wood ash when planting.

Fertilizer: Phosphorus encourages root development and flowering, so blend rock phosphate or super phosphate when planting. Excess nitrogen will cause a burst of vegetative growth that leads to insect and disease problems.

- "Adirondack" 10G \$54.00

Dark carmine buds open to large pink-edged white flowers in spring. Bears persistent orange-red fruit that adds interest in fall and winter. Highly disease resistant. Grows 15-18' high, 12-15' wide.

- "Dolgo" \*10G \$54.00

Blooms early bearing large white flowers. Brilliant crimson fruits are 1 ½" in 10G \$54.00  
 diameter and make delicious jelly. Grows 35-40' tall, 25-30' wide.

- "Indian Magic" 10-15G \$65.00

Bears attractive deep pink, single flowers in spring, followed by bright red fruit that change to golden orange, ½" in diameter. Fruit persist into winter and attract birds. Excellent disease resistance. Grows 15-20' high and wide.

- "Pink Spires" \*10G \$56.00

Bears single, light pink flowers that develop into ½" purple-red fruit that persist into winter. Foliage is red-purple in spring, turning green bronze in summer and copper in the fall. Growth is narrow and upright. Grows 15-20' high, 12" wide.

- "Profusion" \*10G \$58.00

Deep red buds open into purplish-red flowers, which fade to purplish-pink. Dark red fruits follow and persist into winter. Young foliage is purple, then matures to a bronze-green. Growth is rounded. Grows 15-20' high, 30' wide. Zone 4.

- "Red Splendor" \*10G \$60.00

Foliage is glossy reddish green, turning reddish-purple in the fall. In spring, bears single pink flowers that develop into ½" bright red fruit that persists into winter. A good choice for wildlife. Growth habit is upright and spreading. Grows 20-25' high, 20' wide.

*Populus x canadensis* Tower – Tower Poplar 15G \$54.00  
A fast growing, “cotton-less”, disease resistant tree for cold climates. Growth habit is columnar, making this a great choice for screening, windbreaks, sound barriers or an accent plant. Foliage is glossy green with a white underside. Grows 40-50’ high, 6-10’ wide.

*Prunus americana* – American Plum 15G \$56.00  
A small tree, which is excellent for wildlife plantings. Bears white flowers in early spring, followed by edible reddish-yellow fruits. Fall foliage is yellow. Good pollinator for all plum varieties. Drought tolerant. Grows 10-12’ tall and wide.

*Quercus ellipsoidalis* - Northern Pin Oak 10G \$70.00  
Tolerates dry sandy soils and a range of pH. Has a broad oval form when mature. Fall foliage is red. Grows 60’ high, 45’ wide.

*Salix “Prairie Cascade”* – Prairie Cascade Willow 10G \$64.00  
Has a weeping growth habit with a golden stem color which provides winter interest. Requires moist to wet soils. Grows 35-45’ tall, 35-40’ wide.

*Sorbus decora* - Showy Mountain Ash 15G \$68.00  
Bears white flowers, followed by showy red fruit. Slow growing and very hardy. Fall foliage is red. Grows 20-25’ high, 20’ wide.

*Syringa reticulata* - Japanese Tree Lilac 10G \$60.00  
Bears large panicles of creamy white flowers in June and July. Grows 25’ high, 25’ wide. Zone 4.

### DECIDUOUS SHRUBS

*Acer ginnala* - Amur Maple 10G \$36.00  
Attractive shrub with spreading, slender branches, fragrant flowers in April-May, and beautiful orange to scarlet fall foliage. Very adaptable to a range of soil types, and drought tolerant. Sun to part shade. Grows 15-20’ high, 20-25’ wide.

*Acer ginnala “Bailey Compact”* – Bailey Compact Amur Maple 10G \$36.00  
Compact form with fragrant flowers and beautiful orange to red fall color. An extremely hardy shrub adaptable to salt, drought and sandy soils. Sun to part shade. Grows 7-9’ high and wide.

*Aronia melanocarpa var. elata* – Glossy Black Chokeberry 10G \$36.00  
Bears white flowers in May, followed by black fruits which persist into winter. Fall foliage is brilliant red. Grows 4-6’ high, 4-6’ wide.

- Clethra alnifolia* “Hummingbird” – Hummingbird Summersweet 2G \$36.00  
A compact form of summersweet that bears white flowers in midsummer. 5G \$42.00  
Tolerates shade and moist soils. Fall foliage is pale yellow to golden brown. Grows 3-5’ high and 3-4’ wide. Zone 4.
- Clethra alnifolia* “Ruby Spice” – Ruby Spice Summersweet 2G \$33.00  
Bears beautiful, fragrant, bright pink flowers in midsummer. Tolerates sun to 3G \$40.00  
full shade. Fall foliage is yellow. Grows 3-6’ high, 3-4’ wide. Zone 4. 5G \$42.00
- Comptonia peregrina* – Sweetfern 1G \$16.00  
Native shrub with a mounded, spreading habit and sweet smelling foliage. Tolerates moist to dry  
conditions, poor soil, and full sun to part shade. Grows 2-4’ high, 4-8’ wide.
- Cornus alba* “Bailhalo” – Ivory Halo Dogwood \*7G \$32.00  
Foliage is variegated green and white. Bright red stems provide winter interest. Grows 5-6’ high and  
wide.
- Cornus baileyi* - Red Twigged Dogwood \*10G \$40.00  
Beautiful red stems add interest in the winter. Can tolerate sun to shade, and wet to dry soils. Fruits are  
porcelain-blue. Grows 8-10’ high, 8-10’ wide.
- Cornus sericea* “Kelsey” – Kelsey Dwarf Dogwood \*7G \$32.00  
Red-stemmed compact rounded shrub which only grows 2-3’ high and wide. Can be used as a course  
groundcover or in ashrub border. Prefers moist to wet soils and full to part sun. Bears white flowers in  
spring.
- Corylus avellana* “Contorta” – Harry Lauder’s Walkingstick 3G \$38.00  
An unusual shrub with twisted, contorted branches, offering winter interest. Often used in floral  
arrangements. Bears pendant yellow catkins in early spring. Grows 6-8’ high, 4-6’ wide. Zone 4.
- Euonymus alatus* - Winged Euonymus 2G \$26.00  
Bears yellow flowers in May-June. Tolerates sun or shade. Good for screens 5G \$40.00  
and hedges. Fall foliage is bright red. Grows 10’ high, 8-12’ wide.
- Forsythia* “Courtasol” – Gold Tide Forsythia 2G \$28.00  
A ground cover type forsythia which is excellent for mass plantings. Bears lemon yellow flowers in  
early spring and tolerates light shade. Needs moist, well drained soil. Flower buds require good snow  
cover for winter survival. Grows 2-2 ½’ high, 3-4’ wide. Zone 4.
- Forsythia* “Northern Gold” – Northern Gold Forsythia 2G \$26.00  
Bears golden yellow flowers on gray-yellow branches in early spring. Grows 6-8’ high, 5-7’ wide.

- Genista tinctoria* "Royal Gold" – Royal Gold Woadwaxen 5G \$28.00  
Low-growing shrub that bears golden yellow flowers in July. Tolerant of poor, sandy soils, very adaptable and drought tolerant. Grows 1 ½-2' high, 2' wide.
- Hamamelis virginiana* - Witch Hazel 7G \$32.00  
Ribbon-like yellow flowers bloom in late fall. Can tolerate shade and poor soils but develops best form in sun and fertile soil. Fall foliage is golden yellow. Grows 15' high, 12-15' wide.
- Hydrangea arborescens* "Annabelle" – Annabelle Smooth Hydrangea 3G \$46.00  
Large white flower heads in summer. Thrives in shade. Has a low growing rounded form. Grows 4-5' high, 3-5' wide. Very showy.
- Hydrangea arborescens* "Abetwo" – Incrediball Hydrangea 2G \$33.00  
An improved form of Annabelle, this variety has stronger stems and flowers 5G \$36.00 that are up to four times larger. Incredibly showy. Grows 4-5' high, 3-5' wide.
- Hydrangea arborescens* NCHAI – Invincibelle Spirit Hydrangea 3G \$46.00  
A pink flowered form of Annabelle with very large flowers that bloom in summer and rebloom later in the season until frost. Incredibly showy. Grows 3-4' high and wide.
- Hydrangea macrophylla* "Bailmer" – Endless Summer Hydrangea 2G \$30.00  
The original mop-head type hydrangea with the unique ability to bloom consistently on both old and new wood. The flowers grow up to 8" in diameter and turn pink in alkaline soil or blue in acidic soil. Remove spent flower heads to encourage rebloom. This shrub is hardy to Zone 4 and may die back to ground level in the winter. Fall foliage is bronze. Grows 3-5' high and wide.
- Hydrangea paniculata* "Bulk" – Quickfire Hydrangea 2G \$30.00  
Bears flowers that first emerge white, then turn deep pink. Blooms earlier than other hydrangeas, in late May-early June. Grows 6-8' high and wide.
- Hydrangea paniculata* "DVPpinky" – Pinky Winky Hydrangea 2G \$30.00  
Bears large, two-tone pink flowers in mid summer. Flowers first emerge white, then turn pink and continue to push new white blossoms from the tip of the panicle. Blooms typically measure 12-16" long and are held upright on strong stems. Grows 6-8' high and wide.
- Hydrangea paniculata* "HYPMAD I" – White Diamonds Hydrangea 2G \$34.00  
Bears white panicles of flowers that change to pink in the fall. Has a compact growth habit for smaller spaces, growing 4' high, 5' wide.
- Hydrangea paniculata* "ILVOBO" – Bobo Hydrangea 2G \$30.00  
Dwarf shrub that bears large white flowers in summer. Great plant for small places, with an upright, rounded habit. Grows 2 ½'-3' high and 3-4' wide.

*Hydrangea paniculata* “Jane” – Little Lime Hydrangea 2G \$30.00  
Soft lime-green flowers mature to pink and burgundy in fall on this dwarf shrub. Has an upright, rounded shape, growing 3-5’ high and wide.

*Hydrangea paniculata* “Rensun” – Strawberry Sundae Hydrangea 2G \$34.00  
Compact form of Vanilla Strawberry. Flowers emerge white in mid-summer, changing to pink, and finally to strawberry red. Grows 4-5’ high, 3-4’ wide.

*Hypericum kalmianum* “Ames” – Ames Kalm St. Johnswort 2G \$.00  
A perfectly rounded shrub with masses of beautiful 1” golden yellow flowers which open in mid-summer. Grows 2-3’ high and wide. Zone 4.

*Ilex verticillata* “Afterglow” – Afterglow Winterberry 7G \$32.00  
Female selection that blooms early and develops large orange-red fruit that 10G \$35.00  
persist into winter. Needs to be pollinated by Jim Dandy Winterberry to ensure berry production. Grows 3-6’ high, 3-5’ wide, with a compact, rounded growth habit.

*Ilex verticillata* “Southern Gentleman” – Southern Gentleman Winterberry 7G \$32.00  
Male selection needed to pollinate “Winter Red”. Fall foliage is yellowish-green 15G \$40.00  
to purplish-bronze. Grows 6-9’ high and wide.

*Ilex verticillata* “Winter Red”- Winter Red Winterberry 10G \$38.00  
Female selection that develops bright red berries in late summer that persist into winter. Tolerates wet soil and full sun to shade. Needs to be pollinated with “Southern Gentleman”. Grows 6-8’ high, 6-8’ wide.

*Philadelphus* “Snowwhite Fantasy” – Snow White Mockorange 5G \$35.00  
Bears 2” fragrant, double flowers in spring and then reblooms in summer. Has an upright, arching growth habit. Grows 5-6’ high, 4-5’ wide

*Philadelphus x virginialis* “Minnesota Snowflake” – Minnesota Snowflake Mockorange  
Growth habit is vase-shaped, with arching branches. Bears 2” double white 5G \$28.00  
flowers which are very fragrant. Grows 6-8’ high, 5-6’ wide.

*Physocarpus opulifolius* “Center Glow” – Center Glow Ninebark 2G \$30.00  
New growth emerges yellow-green and matures to red. Bears creamy white flowers in spring. Grows 8-10’ high and wide.

*Physocarpus opulifolius* “Donna May” – Little Devil Ninebark 7G \$34.00  
A compact, easy to grow shrub with deep burgandy foliage. Useful in smaller gardens. Needs no pruning and is resistant to pests. Bears white-pink flowers in June. Grows 3-4’ high and wide.

*Physocarpus opulifolius* “*Jefam*” - Amber Jubilee Ninebark 2G \$34.00

A standout shrub for its striking foliage, in glowing tones of orange, yellow, and gold. Bears white flowers in spring. Fall foliage is red and purple. Grows 5-6' high, 4' wide.

*Physocarpus opulifolius* “*Monlo*” – Diabolo Ninebark 3G \$26.00

Beautiful red-purple foliage on long arching canes form an attractive rounded shrub. Growth can be controlled by cutting the foliage back to the ground each spring. Bears creamy white flowers in spring. Needs full sun for best foliage color. Grows 8-10' high, 8-10' wide.

*Physocarpus opulifolius* “*Seward*” – Summer Wine Ninebark 2.5G \$26.00

Compact variety with fine-textured, deeply cut dark crimson leaves. Bears 3G \$30.00 pinkish-white flowers in mid-summer that contrast nicely with the dark foliage. Requires little pruning. Grows 5-6' high and wide.

*Potentilla fruticosa* - Potentilla

Small shrubs which flower profusely all summer. Very adaptable, tolerates dry sandy soils to moist, well drained soils. Can take part shade but flowers best in full sun.

- *Abbotswood* - White flowers. Grows 2-3' high, 2-3' wide. 2.5G \$18.00

- *Crème Brulee* – Double white flowers. Grows 3-3 ½' high, 2-3' wide. 2G \$24.00

- *Gold Drop* - Lemon yellow flowers. Grows 2' high, 2-3' wide. 5G \$22.00

- *Gold Finger* – Showy golden flowers, dark green foliage. Grows 3' high, 2G \$22.00  
3-4' wide.

- *Pink Beauty* - Clear pink flowers. Grows 2' high, 2' wide. 2G \$22.00

- *Mango Tango* – Bicolor flowers with blends of red, orange, and yellow. 2G \$22.00  
Grows 2' high and wide.

*Prunus x cistena* – Purpleleaf Sand Cherry 5G \$40.00

Bears single pink, fragrant flowers in spring, followed by purplish-black fruit. The foliage is a deep purple-red, making this shrub a good accent plant. Grows 6-8' high, 5-6' wide.

*Rhamnus frangula* “*Asplenifolia*” – Fernleaf Buckthorn 7G \$32.00

A handsome plant with cutleaf, fern-like foliage on an upright, spreading plant. Bears small berries that turn red in summer, maturing to black in the fall. Attracts birds. Fall foliage is yellow. Grows 10-15' high, 10-12' wide.

*Rhododendron* “*Purple Gem*” – Purple Gem Rhododendron 2G \$35.00
